#### 5. New business

a. Goals

Goals will be synthesized by Ashley and distributed to everyone Advocacy/outreach- Stu & Mary

Portfolio divided into two main avenues:

- (1) KSAOs for HWP: job/role definition for HWP
  - → Based on work done on curriculum development (by end January)
  - → Based on work done by Alex on student guide (by end January)
  - → Lorenzo Galli at Valencia University started scienceforwork.com to spread scientific research to business and would like to include a strong non-profit stream
  - → Stu has collected roughly 100 critical incidents in 2005 which can be used for this; Lori might have a database of critical incidents, too
- Draft of KSAOs to be distributed to exec by early March for review
- Revise KSAOs by May
- KSAOs on website by June (might need to change to later date)
- → Serves for people to see what additional skills they need to get into HWP + what they can learn in addition if they already are working in the field + what qualifies as HWP and what does not

(2) JOB special issue Stu and Mary will

- brainstorm procedure for encouraging submissions,
- will contact Lori and Ines re submission requirements and procedure
- ensure members are aware of those

(It would be important that the editorial team (Stu, Lori, Ines) do not promote submissions too heavily; but if an outsider to the editorial team (like Mary) could do so it would be helpful)

#### i. Communications- Laura

- (1) Linking together all social media sites (Facebook, Twitter, Linked in)
  - → Maybe add an Instagram account to add more visuals
  - → But would there be photos?
  - → There is not much activity on the Linked in account and the password cannot be retrieved. Could a new Linked in account be created and a link to the new Linked in account posted on the old Linked in account?

## (2) Newsletter + blog

- 2-3 newsletters per year, Tara has content to be included
- monthly blog posts (including posts by guest posters), ideally there would be two posts per month
  One blog post could be about the new executive board and a link to the membership site
- ii. Networking/recruitment- Peter No goals available yet
- iii. Website- Doug
  - (1) Website software maintenance (e.g. updates for forums)
  - (2) *Uploading of documents* (e.g. meeting minutes, newsletters)
  - (3) Get 1-2 additional people to be able to update the website (could be board members or people outside the board)
  - (4) Investigate option for members to add keywords into a search function (once logged in only), so members can search for others with similar research interests or in similar geographic regions
    - → Wordpress might allow for this, Drew has been asked for input

#### 6. Other business

- a. Website payment details/fundraising
  - Doug finding out if website could be paid via autopay rather than credit card
  - Payment due on 24 February
  - Doug will search for email previously sent to members requesting donations
  - There are also websites on which members could sign up to become patrons = provide regular payments. Doug will forward link to Ashley
- b. MOOC update
  - Email to members interested in curriculum development and forum entry requesting input on MOOC yielded a number of content suggestions

- MOOC will most likely focus on humanitarian aid part of HWP with examples of humane work stream of HWP in the last week (week 6)
- A 2 minute introductory video will be recorded on 19 January
- The final MOOC proposal will be presented to the University of Cape Town (UCT) steering committee on 5 February, following which it is decided if the MOOC will be funded
- UCT issued a call for a visiting scholar grant; this could assist an African scholar to visit UCT and record content for the MOOC in order to increase the African voice.
